MONITORING QUEENSTOWN TOWN CENTRE STRATEGY

PURPOSE

To present to the Strategy Committee the first monitoring report on implementation of the Queenstown Town Centre Strategy.

BACKGROUND

The Queenstown Town Centre Strategy was adopted in December 2009. It identified actions to achieve the vision and objectives of the strategy and prioritised their implementation. However, approval of the strategy did not include funding for these actions which will require further consideration through the Annual Plan and Long Term Plan (LTP) process. Projects that are currently not funded will need to be considered by the Council at the next review of the LTP and priority projects will need to be identified.

Monitoring of progress will assist in the identification of funding needs for actions identified in the strategy. This monitoring report outlines the progress on the implementation of these priority actions.

The Queenstown Town Centre Strategy contributes to the following community outcomes:

- High quality urban environments respectful of the character of individual communities
- A strong and diverse economy
- Preservation and celebration of the district's local cultural heritage
- Effective and efficient infrastructure that meets the needs of growth

DISCUSSION

The Queenstown Town Centre strategy states that the implementation of the strategy will be monitored on an annual basis to assist in the identification of new actions that need to be prioritised in the work programme for the following year. In addition the strategy will be reviewed and updated after 5 years.

Despite economic and budgetary constraints, the implementation of a number of actions identified in the town centre strategy has continued, although the timeline of some projects has been adversely affected.

While unfortunate it is considered that this is inevitable in any strategy that is intended to provide longer term guidance. The strategy acknowledges that the nature, timing and final format of these projects may need to alter to reflect:

- The results of more detailed investigations
- Changes in community priorities
- The duration of the strategy
- The economy

The action plan is attached to this report with a column providing commentary on progress. Actions that had funding already allocated in the current LTP were given a timeline for implementation.

Projects with no timeline allocated in the action plan do not currently have funding and Council will need to consider prioritising these projects at the next review of the LTP.

A change in focus by the New Zealand Transport Agency has resulted in a reduction of funding support for a number of transport related projects which may affect their timing.

In addition the decision to undertake a review of the District Plan has resulted in a number of separate items being incorporated in this project. However, a plan change to investigate noise issues in the town centre is being progressed independently of the review at present.

Key un-prioritised projects that Council may wish to consider for the next LTP review include:

- Athol Street revitalisation for open space and transport
- Marine Parade destination playground
- Funding the Central Area Street Improvement Programme
