MINUTE (26 July 2018)

Introduction

- [1] The Registrar has referred to us:
 - the memorandum dated 23 July 2018 of counsel (Ms Hockly) for the Council filed in response to the court's Minute dated 17 July 2018 relating to the appeals on Stage 1 of the PDP of the Queenstown Lakes District Council ("QLDC");
 - a memorandum on the Topics 1 to 3 for the Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society of NZ Inc ("Forest and Bird") dated 20 July 2018;
 - an email from the Upper Clutha Environmental Society Inc ("UCESI") dated
 21 July 2018.
- [2] This Minute responds to issues raised in those memoranda in an effort by giving amended directions now to avoid parties having to later retrace too many steps.



QLDC APPEALS - MINUTE 26 JULY 2018

Topic allocation

- [3] The court's Minute dated 17 July 2018 suggested a general approach whereby appeals on related topics should be mediated and/or heard together, and appeals related to higher order issues should be dealt with first. The Minute identified a set of six higher order topics the Strategic Topics which correspond broadly to the strategic objectives in Chapter 3 Strategic Direction.
- [4] As a preliminary point the Council advises that there are no appeals on Strategic Topic 5. Accordingly, Topic 5 will be removed from the topic list and another Topic 5 identified in due course.
- [5] Ms Hockly states for the Council that it will be important to ensure that all parties and the court are aligned as to which of the Strategic Topics each of the Strategic Policies fall into. In many instances the Strategic Policies explicitly cross-reference to more than one Strategic Objective and as a result cross-reference more than one of the Strategic Topics listed in the Minute¹.
- [6] The Council has built on the breakdown provided by the court and provided a suggested approach for the assignment of each of the Strategic Policies to what it considers to be the most appropriate Strategic Topic.

[7] Ms Hockly adds:

Given the large number of appeal points, the Council has further built on the breakdown provided by the court by allocating the Strategic Topics into subtopics. The Council considers that these subtopics will assist the parties to prepare their cases in a coherent manner. The Council has provided its suggestions on these subtopics at this stage in order to give the parties opportunity to provide comment.

[8] The Council's suggested allocation of the Strategic Policies and proposed subtopics are listed in Annexure X to this Minute. Column A shows the court's suggested six higher order topics in black text with the Council's proposed additions/amendments



Ms Hockly gives as examples Strategic Policies 3.3.14, 3.3.15, 3.3.17, 3.3.18, 3.3.19, 3.3.21, 3.3.25 and 3.3.26. The information in brackets at the end of each of these Strategic Policies shows that they relate to more than one Strategic Objective, and that these Strategic Objectives are from different suites of objectives.

in red text. Column B usefully sets out the Council's proposed subtopic breakdowns especially in relation to the strategic policies in Chapter 3.

- [9] The Council has noted that many appeals seek that new provisions be added into Chapters 3, 4 and 6 by way of relief without specifically referring to a particular PDP provision. The Council considers it is appropriate to group those appeal points into the relevant Strategic Topics and subtopics according to the subject matter of the relief and it has identified those in Appendix A to its memorandum.
- [10] Subject to the matters raised below, we consider the Council's analysis (as now shown in Appendix X to this Minute) usefully expands on the court's analysis of suggested topics. Accordingly, we will direct that Appendix X replace the earlier analysis of topics.
- [11] The various appellants who may be affected should ensure that their notices of appeal are listed in the court's Appendix 1, 2 or 3 as attached to the Minute of 17 July 2018.

Topic 1 - Resilient Economy

- [12] The Council refers to the fact that a number of appeal points seek the insertion of a new "waterways" chapter. Noting that the relief generally relates to tourism issues, the Council has suggested that these appeal points are relevant to the topic of a resilient economy and should form a subtopic within Strategic Topic 1.
- [13] The court has no strong view on the matter but queries whether this might not be better heard with the Council's Topic 2 subtopic 9? It seeks the views of parties other than the respondent.
- [14] Topic 1 looks like a very broad topic if all the important subtopics cannot be dealt with in the first two weeks of hearing time, further time can be allotted at the initial judicial conference in the week of 3 September 2018.

Topic 2 - Landscape

ENVIRONT OF THE SEAL OF THE SE

[15] The Council considers that Topic 2 should include all the appeal points seeking amendments to the location of any Outstanding Natural Landscape ("ONL") and/or any Outstanding Natural Feature ("ONF") and notes that the majority of these appeals seek

a different zoning for the appellants' land. Ms Hockly submits that the principles in *Man* o' *War Station Limited v Auckland Council*² ("*Man o' War*"), dictate that these appeal points should be dealt with before any appeals on the text provisions in Chapter 6, and before any consideration of the appropriate zone (and related text provisions) for the land. Consequently, the Council proposes a separate subtopic within Strategic Topic 2 for these appeal points.

[16] *Man o' War* makes it quite clear that identification of ONLs and ONFs is a question of fact³ which should logically precede hearing of any appeals about the "conceptually separate" policy framework. In our view the logical sequence for Topic 2 is:

- (a) identification of most⁵ ONLs and ONFs and their limits or boundaries;
- (b) resolution of appeals on strategic objectives and policies;
- (c) resolution of appeals on methods (including zonings) and rules including assessment matter.

We consider the first stage of hearings on Topic 2 should begin to resolve (a), and may begin to resolve (b). But all issues under (c) should neither be mediated nor timetabled for evidence at this stage because that would be premature given the uncertainty over (a) and (b).

[17] In terms of the Council's analysis of Strategic Topic 2 in subtopics, we provisionally consider the initial hearing should include subtopics 1 to 4 in Appendix X (in addition to the strategic topics in the left-hand column).

Topic 3 - Urban Growth

[18] The Council has suggested⁶ allocation to Topic 3 of all appeal points requesting that the Urban Growth Boundary be relocated or deleted, in order that Urban Growth Boundary may be considered in its entirety as a strategic matter. That appears logical to

us provided it includes appeal points seeking relief in relation to population growth and the National Policy Statement on Urban Development Capacity.

Topic 2 or Topic 4?

[19] With respect to the Forest and Bird memorandum and the UCESI email both dated 20 July 2018. Forest and Bird suggests that its appeal on Strategic Policy 3.3.17 (referenced as appeal ENV-2018-CHC-133-002 by the QLDC in its Appendix A) might appropriately be dealt with as part of Topic 2. The UCESI agrees.

[20] The Council, on the other hand, says that Strategic Policy 3.3.17 relates directly to indigenous ecosystems and biodiversity, so it has allocated appeals on Strategic Policy 3.3.17 to Topic 4. Obviously, as Ms Hockly concedes, there is a link between the subject matters of Topics 2 and 4: Topic 2 deals with landscapes and rural environment and Topic 4 deals with indigenous ecosystems and biodiversity. However, we provisionally accept the Council's view that the content of Topic 4 is more directly related to the matters raised in Forest and Bird's appeal and that appeal point ENV-2018-CHC-133-002 is most appropriately allocated to Topic 4.

[21] Forest and Bird also enquires whether Chapters 21 and 22 will be heard in Strategic Topic 2. UCESI considers that it would be appropriate for Chapter 21 to be heard in Topic 2. The court's Minute at para [2] set out the 'directly related subsequent chapters' that the court considers should be heard with the Strategic Topics are listed in para 13 of the Minute. Paragraph 13 does not include Chapters 21 or 22. The reason for that is that the PDP contains a clear distinction between the strategic chapters (such as Chapters 3 and 6) and the zone specific chapters (such as Chapters 21 and 22). We provisionally accept Ms Hockly's submission that it would be most appropriate to manage Chapters 21 and 22 separately from Topic 2. This approach reflects the hierarchy of the PDP and gives the parties (and the court) the opportunity to address the higher order matters contained in Chapters 3 and 6 prior to addressing any detailed relief on the zone provisions contained in Chapters 21 and 22.

Schedules A to C

ENWIROUMEN COURT OF THE

[22] As a consequence of the reallocation of appeal points between Topics 1 to 3, the court's Schedules A to C to its 17 July Minute are incorrect.

[23] We agree that it is appropriate to utilise Appendices B, C and D to the QLDC memorandum as a starting point for the other parties to provide comment as to which of Strategic Topics 1 to 3 they consider their appeals relate to (rather than Appendices A to C to the 17 July Minute).

Directions

[24] We direct:

- (1) the directions in the Minute dated 17 July 2018 are confirmed subject to the following changes or additions;
- (2) that the Council's list of the Strategic Topics shown in the table annexed to this Minute as "X" is adopted in full (including the list of subtopics in Column B) but subject to any further order of the court after hearing from the parties;
- (3) accordingly, the direction in para [34] of the Minute dated 17 July 2018 applies to the list of topics (1) to (3) as described in Appendix X to this Minute (and the parties should note the Council's efforts to identify the relevant notices of appeal in the Schedules attached to its 23 July 2018 memorandum;
- (4) the time for complying with direction 34(1) of the Minute dated 17 July 2018 is extended to 10 August 2018. In other words, all appellants who have not been included in Appendix B, C or D to the Council's memorandum dated 23 July 2018 and think that they should be, must advise the Registrar, the parties and the Council, on or before 10 August 2018; and
- (5) that any party that has comments on the proposed subtopics recorded in the second column B of the table annexed as "X" provide those comments to the Council by 10 August 2018 in order that the Council may report on those comments and any amendments to the subtopics as part of its memorandum to be filed with the court on 24 August 2018 (or such reasonable further period as may be allowed).
