Ladies Mile Feedback

Hello,

As stated in the Frankton Establishment Report:

'The New Zealand Transport agency is cautious about approving a large number of high-density residential dwellings on Ladies Mile because of the traffic capacity issues along SH6/SH6A, particularly in terms of the Shotover Bridge and through Frankton into Queenstown.'

I wish to strongly oppose any further development along Ladies Mile between the Shotover Bridge and Strains Road (SH6). With up to 1100 homes proposed, the highway and bridge will not be able to cope with the extra 2000-4000 extra vehicles using it every day.

Also, what environmental impact research will be conducted with this many homes and people living so close to pristine Lake Hayes?

I think other more suitable areas should be developed for housing first, such as Quail Rise and Remarkable's Park - both within walking distance to shops and services. Frankton and Queenstown will just not cope with such a huge increase in population if we go ahead with up to 1100 new homes on Ladies Mile.
