SUMMARY EVIDENCE OF SASCHA HERBERT ON BEHALF OF GIBBSTON VALLEY STATION

INTRODUCTION

- 1. My name is Sascha Herbert. I am a winemaker for Gibbston Valley Wines (GVW). I have been in this position with GVW since 2006. I have a Bachelor of Agricultural Science with Oenology major from The University of Adelaide, Australia.
- 2. Evidence was provided by our Chief Winemaker, Mr Christopher Keys in regard to the proposal from Gibbston Valley Station (GVS). I have read his evidence in chief dated 12 June 2017 and confirm that I agree with his comments and findings.
- 3. I have also reviewed the proposed Structure Plan that identifies the areas shown for Productive Planting (which I understand to be for viticultural or horticultural plantings). I am very familiar with these areas of the station and agree with Mr Keys (paragraph 3.14) that these are the areas of the station that are suitable for viticulture.
- 4. Mr Keys and I have discussed our current and future Rosé and Methode Traditionelle wine production demands. I agree with Mr Keys in the requirement for a cool climate fruit suitable for these wine styles from the Gibbston sub-region.
- 5. Gibbston possesses a complex array of grape growing sites, ranging from very good to very unsuitable. I agree with Mr Keys that the areas shown for development on the north side of the highway (areas AA2 and AA5) would be unsuitable for vines.
- 6. I have been advised that the area of plantings near AA3 relates to a requirement in a resource consent approved to GVS. GVW is proposing to install the infrastructure for these vineyards plantings in preparation for the planting of the grapes in the spring of 2018.
