CONSENT ORDER

- A: Under s279(1)(b) of the Resource Management Act 1991, the Environment Court, by consent, <u>orders</u> that:
 - (1) the appeals are allowed to the extent that the Queenstown Lakes District Council is directed to amend the provisions concerning Chapter 12 (Queenstown Town Centre: Entertainment Precinct) of the Proposed Queenstown Lakes District Plan, as set out in Appendix 1, attached to and forming part of this Order;
 - (2) the appeals are otherwise dismissed.



B: Under s285 of the Resource Management Act 1991, there is no order as to costs.

REASONS

Introduction

- [1] These proceedings concern appeals by Kopuwai Investments Limited and Republic Hospitality Group Limited against part of a decision of the Queenstown Lakes District Council on Chapter 12 of the proposed Queenstown Lakes District Plan Stage 1. In particular, they relate to Topic 8 (Town Centres), Subtopic 4 (Entertainment Precinct).
- [2] The court has now read and considered the consent memorandum of the parties dated 13 June 2019, which proposes to resolve these appeals.

Other relevant matters

- [3] Imperium Group has given notice of an intention to become a party under s274 of the Resource Management Act ('the RMA') and has signed the memorandum setting out the relief sought.
- [4] Other consent orders which have been filed in relation to the proposed district plan are being held in abeyance. The court is satisfied that these orders are able to be made at this time since the appeals involve a discrete issue which will not impact on other proposed plan appeals before the court.

Orders

- [5] The court makes this order under s279(1) RMA, such order being by consent, rather than representing a decision or determination on the merits pursuant to s297. The court understands for present purposes that:
 - (a) all parties to the proceedings have executed the memorandum requesting this order; and



(b) all parties are satisfied that all matters proposed for the court's endorsement fall within the court's jurisdiction and conform to the relevant requirements and objectives of the RMA including, in particular, pt 2.
