CONSENT MEMORANDUM

May it Please the Court:

- Anne Te Maiharoa Dodds, Tumuaki for Waitaha Tai Whenua O Waitaki Trust Board, made a submission on the proposed Regional Policy Statement for Otago (PORPS).
- 2 On 9 December 2016 an appeal was lodged on the decisions version of the PORPS.
- Notices were given under Section 274 of the Act by Central South Island Fish & Game Council, Otago Fish & Game Council, Queenstown Park Limited, Remarkables Park Limited, Hokonui Runanga, Kati Huirapa Runaka ki Puketeraki, Te Runanga o Moeraki, Te Runanga o Otakou and Te Runaga o Ngai Tahu.
- In the appeal the appellant requested that the PORPS be amended to provide the respondent "will consult with Waitaha lwi whose primary ancestor Rakaihautu as well as Ngai Tahu etc."
- It has been agreed to amend PORPS to give effect in part to the eelief sought by the appellant.

CONSENT ORDER

Introduction
